Culture and Health: Ethnographic Perspectives and Methods

8th to 20th July 2025 Sahyadri Campus, Indian Institute of Technology Palakkad (IITPKD), Kanjikode, Palakkad, Kerala-678623

This course is intended for researchers examining (mental) health, animal health, public health and forms of healing in their social and cultural contexts which can profoundly shape conceptions of illness and illness outcomes. Particular readings will demonstrate certain positive features of India's capacity to cope with mental illness which ideally should not be compromised as the country's mental health treatment policies respond to the Movement for Global Mental Health. The course provides ethnographic case studies from different parts of the world which students will examine in relation to cases from India and other parts of South Asia. A section of the class will focus on mental health which is especially shaped by its cultural milieu, and the readings will consider studies of how the treatment of mental illness in India is affected by the International Movement for Global Mental Health. In addition, Prof. Halliburton will share his experience conducting fieldwork in India and the United States in an effort to help students become aware of the variety of methods available for studying culture and health.

Objectives

The primary objectives of the course are as follows:

1) Understand the degree to which health and illness are shaped by social and cultural forces.

- 2) Develop comparative insights from reading and discussing case studies from around the world
- 3) Learn about ethnographic research methods used in anthropology and other social sciences
- 4)Assess the opportunities and challenges of mental health practices in India

Prof. Murphy Halliburton teaches in the anthropology department at Queens College and the anthropology PhD program at the Graduate Center of the City University of New York. He specializes in medical and psychological anthropology, science and technology studies, and the anthropology of South Asia. His work involves long-term, critical engagement with biomedical psychiatric practices based on fieldwork in southern India and the United States. He has also tracked the effects of global patent policies on pharmaceutical production and biopiracy in India, and he is currently investigating peer-led alternatives to mainstream psychiatry in the northeastern United States. He is the author of *Mudpacks and Prozac: Experiencing Ayurvedic, Biomedical, and Religious Healing* (Routledge, 2009) and *India and the Patent Wars* (Cornell University Press, 2017).

Dr Sudarshan R Kottai serves as an assistant professor in the department of humanities and social sciences at the Indian Institute of Technology Palakkad and as a distinguished fellow at the Centre for Equity Studies, New Delhi. Trained as a clinical psychologist, his experiences learning and working at state-run mental health training institutions critically illuminate research on 'modern' mental health systems in the Global South and their 'relationship' with the wider social world. Informed by the politics, history and philosophy of psy disciplines, he examines the complexities and ambiguities of increasing metricalisation, technocratisation, globalization and scientifisation of mental health care. He grapples with questions of philosophical interest in mental health like why mainstream mental health academia/research/ practice primarily engages in "mirroring" the world rather than in "world-making".


